SECTION 1: CONDITIONS AND UNDERTAKINGS BY BIDDER IN RESPECT OF THIS BID

1. **Proprietary Information**

Road Traffic Management Corporation (RTMC) considers this bid and all related information, either written or verbal, which is provided to the bidder, to be proprietary to RTMC. The bidder shall not disclose, publish, or advertise this specification or related information to any third party without the prior written consent of RTMC.

2.2 All the documentation submitted in response to this bid must be in English.

2.3 All enquiries will be responded to until 10/02/2016

2.4 The RTMC may respond to any enquiry in its sole discretion and the bidder acknowledges that it will have no claim against the RTMC on the basis that its bid was disadvantaged by lack of information, or inability to resolve ambiguities.

3. **Validity Period**

Responses to this bid received from bidders will be valid for a period of **120 days** counted from the closing date of the bid.

4. **Supplier Performance Management**

4.1 Supplier Performance Management is viewed by the RTMC as critical component in ensuring value for money acquisition and good supplier relations between the RTMC and all its suppliers.

4.2 The successful bidder shall upon receipt of written notification of an award, be required to conclude a Service Level Agreement (SLA) with the RTMC, which will form an integral part of the agreement. The SLA will serve as a tool to measure, monitor and assess the supplier's performance level and ensure effective delivery of service, quality and value-add to RTMC business.

5. Instructions on submission of Bids

- 5.1 Bids should be submitted in **Five (5) copies** and one electronic copy (on CD in PDF format) all bound in a sealed envelope endorsed, **RTMC BID 31/2015/16: Request for Proposals from competent TV production and theatrical production service providers to develop production concepts in long running soapies, educational drama series, theatrical productions and TV documentaries for RTMC**
- 5.2 The bid must be in a sealed envelope and must be placed in the bid box at the Main Reception area of the RTMC Building, Boardwalk Office Park, Boardwalk Boulevard, Phase 5, Faerie Glen, Pretoria East by no later than the **22 February 2015 at 11h00am**.
- 5.3 A valid tax clearance certificate must be included in the bid response, or proof of application endorsed by SARS in this regard.
- 5.4 The bidder's company name, closing date and the return address must also be endorsed on the envelope.
- 5.5 All bids submitted must be signed by a person or persons duly authorised thereto.
- 5.6 If a courier service company is being used for delivery of the bid document, the bid description must be endorsed on the delivery note/courier packaging to ensure that documents are delivered into the bid box. The RTMC will not be held responsible for any delays where documents are not placed in the bid box before closing time.
- 5.7 Bid received by telegram, telex, email, facsimile or similar medium will not be considered.
- 5.8 Where a bid document is not placed in the bid box at the time of the bid closing, such a bid document will be regarded as a late bid. Late bids will not be considered.
- 5.9 Amended bids may be sent in an envelope marked "**Amendment to Bid**" and should be placed in the bid box before the closing time.

5.10 Where a bid has a **compulsory briefing session** as a condition, bidders who do not attend or send a representative **will be automatically disqualified** and bid responses will not be accepted/evaluated.

5.11 Bidders should check the numbers of the pages to satisfy themselves that none are missing or duplicated. No liability will be accepted by RTMC in regard to anything arising from the fact that pages are missing or duplicated.

6. Undertakings by the Bidder

6.1 The bidder accepts that all costs incurred in preparation, presentation and any demonstration in relation to this bid shall be for the account of the bidder.

6.2 The bidder hereby offer to render all or any of the services described in the attached documents to the RTMC on the terms and conditions and in accordance with the specifications stipulated in this bid documents (and which shall be taken as part of, and incorporated into, this proposal at the prices inserted therein).

6.3 The bidder shall prepare for a possible presentation should RTMC require such and the bidder shall be notified thereof no later than 4 (four) days before the actual presentation date. Such presentation may include demonstration of products or services as called for by the RTMC in relation to this bid.

6.4 The successful bidder hereby accept full responsibility for the proper execution and fulfilment of all obligations and conditions devolving on him/her under this agreement as the principal(s) liable for the due fulfilment of this contract.

6.5 The bidder furthermore confirm that he/she has satisfied himself/herself as to the correctness and validity of his/her bid response that the price(s) and rate(s) quoted cover all the work/item(s) specified in the bid response documents and that the price(s) and rate(s) cover all his/her obligations under a resulting contract and that he/she accept that any mistakes regarding price(s) and calculations will be at his/her risk

7. RTMC's Rights

7.1 The RTMC reserves the right not to accept the lowest bid or any bid in part or in whole. RTMC normally awards the contract to the bidder who proves to be fully capable of handling

the contract and whose bid is technically acceptable and/or financially advantageous to the RTMC.

- 7.2 The RTMC also reserves the right to award this bid as a whole or in part without furnishing reasons.
- 7.3 The RTMC reserves the right to conduct a site visit at the premises of the offices or at any client sites if so required.
- 7.4 The RTMC reserves a right to amend any bid conditions, validity period, specifications, or extend the closing date of bid prior to the initially stated closing date. Bidders will be advised in writing of such amendments in good time.
- 7.5 The RTMC reserves the right to request all relevant information, agreements and other documents to verify information supplied in the bid response. 8. Supplier Development and Promotion of Emerging Black Owned Service Provider

- 8.1 The RTMC promotes enterprise development In this regard, successful bidders are encouraged to mentor SMME's and/or Youth owned businesses. The implications of such arrangement will be be subject to negotiations between the RTMC and the successful bidder.
- 8.2 It is also the objective of the RTMC to promote transformation of the South African economy and as such, bidders are encouraged to partner with a black owned entity (being 50%+1 black owned and controlled). Such partnership may include the formation of a Joint Venture and/ or subcontracting agreement etc., where a portion of the work under this bid would be undertaken by black owned entities.
- 8.3 To give effect to this requirement, bidders are required to submit a partnership/ subcontracting proposal detailing the portion of work to be outsourced, level of involvement of the black owned partner and where relevant, submit a consolidated B-BBEE scorecard in-line with the provisions of the PPPFA Regulations which will be considered as part of the B-BBEE scoring.

SECTION 2: TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS SPECIFICATION

1. PURPOSE OF THE PROJECT

RTMC seeks to appoint a service provider with expertise in Television (TV) and Theatrical Production. The appointed Service Provider will be contracted by RTMC for a period of three (3) years with an option to extend. The contract is subject to monitoring and review.

2. PROJECT SCOPE

The appointed Service provider is to have relevant expertise in television production and in the development, execution and monitoring of the following:

i. Story Intergration

- Providing access to RTMC to long running soapies for the purpose of story intergration, to communicate, educate and reinforce road safety messages to a captive audience .
- Providing RTMC a platform over a period, through the use of story integration within a soapie/s which commands high viewership numbers that are measurable, attracting and addressing the diverse SA population.
- Development and production of story line with road safety messaging integrated in the episodes of the current running soapie/s
- Development of story integration episodes in the current soapies with an aim of educating and increasing road safety awareness to the target audiences.
- Overall project management of this production, including frequent reports to client on progress and deliverables.

ii. Educational Drama Series

- Development and production of a 24 minute, 13-part educational drama series, exploring the importance of Road Safety and bringing information to the public on the role RTMC plays in encouraging safety on our roads.
- Package the series and make ready for broadcast, at the legislated broadcast quality specifications and format.
- To establish a relationship and manage a licensing deal with the major broadcaster for the series.
- Facilitate the promotion and marketing of the series through the broadcaster and through other media platforms to ensure its success and meeting of objectives.
- Overall project management of this production, including frequent reports to client on progress and deliverables.

iii. TV Documentaries

- Development and production of a 48 minute, 2-part documentary, profiling the Department of Transport as a whole and mainly focusing on the importance of Road Safety and bringing information to the public on the role RTMC plays in encouraging safety on our roads.
- Package the documentary series and make ready for broadcast, at the legislated broadcast quality specifications and format.

- Facilitate the promotion and marketing of the documentary through the broadcaster and through other media platforms to ensure its success and meeting of objectives.
- Overall project management of this production, including frequent reports to client on progress and deliverables.

iv. Theatrical and Conventional Production

- Develop and produce a brief industrial theatre piece communicating the importance of Road Safety and the vital role of the RTMC in respect to safety on our roads.
- Map and execute a roadshow rollout plan for the theatrical production that will ensure a wide spread reach across the regions.
- Overall project management of this production, including frequent reports to client on progress and deliverables.

3. OBJECTIVES

The undertaking of developing TV and Theatrical Production is carried out with the following objectives to be addressed within content development:

Advocacy:

- Enhance the effectiveness of road safety programmes through viewer engagement;
- Encourage appropriate road behavior through thought-provoking and interrogative storyline development;
- In support of road safety, encourage public/viewer participation in local and national road safety matters aligned to the approved road safety programmes and/or campaigns;

Education and Awareness:

- Identification of road safety needs of vulnerable road users unique to varying communities identified to be incorporated in storylines;
- Encourage cultural change that supports safe road users behaviour within the public;
- Undertake and assist with the dissemination of road safety information for the benefit of communities/public;
- Assist with the implementation of behaviour change programmes that aims to reduce the incidence and severity of road fatalities, pedestrian incidences and injuries;
- Provide education and awareness to communities/public through edu-tainment formatting;
- Monitor and report on the impact of developed TV productions;
- Attend periodic round table discussions on pertinent road safety issues.

Popularization - Structure Development & Community/Public Participation:

- Identify areas with high incidents of road injuries and fatalities and incorporate into storylines;
- Educate public on maintenance and upkeep of infrastructure
- Conscientise the public to the usage of road usage is for brought about by *'Many Roads for a Connected South Africa'*, thereby conscientising creating an integrated national road infrastructure that all South Africans can be proud

- 5.3 Bidders other than EMEs must submit their original and valid B-BBEE status level verification certificate or a certified copy thereof, substantiating their B-BBEE rating issued by a Registered Auditor approved by IRBA or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS.
- 5.4 A trust, consortium or joint venture, will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as a legal entity, provided that the entity submits their B-BBEE status level certificate.
- 5.5 A trust, consortium or joint venture will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as an unincorporated entity, provided that the entity submits their consolidated B-BBEE scorecard as if they were a group structure and that such a consolidated B-BBEE scorecard is prepared for every separate bid.
- 5.6 Tertiary institutions and public entities will be required to submit their B-BBEE status level certificates in terms of the specialized scorecard contained in the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice.
- 5.7 A person will not be awarded points for B-BBEE status level if it is indicated in the bid documents that

such a bidder intends sub-contracting more than 25% of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not qualify for at least the points that such a bidder qualifies for, unless the intended subcontractor is an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the sub-contract.

5.8 A person awarded a contract may not sub-contract more than 25% of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not have an equal or higher B-BBEE status level than the person concerned, unless the contract is sub-contracted to an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the sub-contract.
